## Round Two of the Paycheck Protection **Program Comes to an End**

The second round of the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) has recently wrapped up. In total, Harvest Bankers issued nearly 400 loans, distributing over \$10 million in PPP funds this year to area small businesses. These funds protected hundreds of jobs and helped many businesses weather the pandemic economy.

ATM fees are on the rise generally; a single stop for cash can cost you \$3 or more in fees; that can add up to hundreds of dollars per year! Here are three ways to tackle that problem, with your Harvest Bank debit card:

- 1. Find a Privileged Status (surcharge-free) ATM near you at https://www.shazam.net/ATMs/.
  - A.M. Maus & Son (located at Hwys 15 and 55 in Kimball)
  - Casey's Gas Station
    - o 309 Pleasant Ave W, Atwater
    - o 1021 19th Ave SW, Willmar

- 2. Open a Kasasa Cash® or Kasasa Cash Back® checking account with us, qualify for the rewards in a given month, and get up to \$25 refunded on ATM fees. withdrawal nationwide (up monthly/maximum \$3 per transaction).
- 3. OR, ask for cash back at the store, and save a bundle! Simply ask for cash back when you use your debit card for purchases at retail stores! Cash back from a retailer is surcharge-free.

### Minnesota Senior Linkage Line

Harvest Bank staff recently attended a virtual presentation by Senior LinkAge Line® staff on how to identify and prevent Medicare fraud, waste, and abuse. The Senior Linkage Line is a statewide information and assistance service for older adults and their caregivers. We invite you to clip-and-save the number at the bottom of this article.

Medicare fraud wastes billions of dollars every year. Though some people aren't directly impacted by it, all enrollees are impacted indirectly, as fraud causes things to be more expensive. Still, there is a lot you can do to protect yourself from Medicare fraud, waste, and abuse. The number one thing is to be aware.

Unfortunately, Medicare fraud comes in many forms. Sometimes, fraud can come from people you know-doctors, nurses, other medical staff, etc. – when they provide services and medications that you don't actually need. Other scammers contact you over the phone, via email, via text, and in other ways that make it less easy to know fraud is happening.

In addition to Medicare-related concerns, you can also call Minnesota Senior Linkage Line with your questions concerning multiple topics: housing/nursing homes, transportation, legal aid, forms assistance, and local volunteering opportunities — to name a few! State agencies are utilized by call center staff, if the staff cannot directly assist the caller on his/her own. The line is staffed predominantly by social workers around the state.

In summary, you can call the Senior Linkage Line to be connected to local services, get answers to your questions, and get the help you need.

Finally, please take the following actions if you suspect Identity Theft:

- Contact the Federal Trade Commission's Identification Theft Hotline at 1-877-438-4338.
- If your Medicare card is lost or stolen, report it to Social Security right away at 1-800-772-1213.
